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Forum *Overview*

Purpose

The challenges that we face in our communities should not be viewed in isolation. It is essential that a national forum be held to address these challenges head on. The objectives of the forum are:

- To share best practice ideas on what we can achieve with youth employment at the local level
- o To deepen networks and address the 'big picture' of trends on the issues of income and work
- o To develop pathways of action to meet the taskforce goals:

By 2005, no young person under 25 years will be out of work or training in our communities. By 2009, all people in our communities will have the opportunity to be in work or training.

We hope that at the conclusion of the forum, each participant will have a deeper awareness of those initiatives working well in other communities and stronger national networks to draw upon in their own community efforts.

Opportunity

The forum has been structured with a mix of presentations and discussion breaks to provide an overview of *what initiatives are working* and *where* as well as the time to debate the issues. The forum has also been opened up to key workers and relevant government agencies from both national and regional levels to attend. It is envisaged this will provide an opportunity to address the need of a combined intersectoral approach to the goals of the Taskforce.

Challenge

The critical issues are not new. The challenge lies in our ability to:

- o Influence real job creation
- o Apply longer-term thinking to the employment issue
- o Devise programmes which are effective in addressing the Maori and Pacific Island unemployment in our communities
- o Halt the decline of rural and regional communities
- o Develop a more active partnership between local and central government
- Encourage government organisations to be flexible in the way they allocate resources at a local level
- o Access local funding for projects and initiatives at local level

 - Youthworks (New Plymouth)- Elaine Gill Youthworks is a collaborative project that links unemployed youth to 'Not- for- Profit' organisations. The aim is to ultimately link the needs and resources of both groups in the community.
 - Buller Youthworks (Buller) Pat Barr-McLeod Buller Youthworks is a very successful Youth Transitions service that has assisted many young people into apprenticeships, jobs and training. Holistic in their approach, they work very closely with the high school and other service providers to achieve the best for their clients.

Council cadet initiatives

 MTFJ – Jan Francis
 An overview and history of cadet and youth recruitment projects within Councils throughout NZ

o New Plymouth- Caroline Winstanley In 2002, NPDC made a three year commitment to employ 14 young unemployed people. It is a collaborative project with CEG, TEC, TPK and Work and Income. In its second year of operation it has transformed the lives of those involved by: equipping them with basic employment skills, the opportunity to work in a number of different departments and the ability to compete with other job applicants in the labour market.

o Manukau - Anne Candy Launched in 2003, Manukau has taken on 30 cadets to work within the Council, its contractors and in other areas such as Serco. Cadets are provided with National Certificate in Employment skills and the opportunity to put theory into practice. A collaborative project involving TEC and Work and Income it is hoped that the 2004 cadets will include eight very long-term unemployed Youth (4yr +) and twenty-two clients(26wk +) all under the age of 25

- City Care Ltd (Christchurch) Richard Lauder CEO
 City Care Ltd is a private contracting company that is offering a pre-apprenticeship training programme. The success factors include: full time paid employment in a true work environment with the opportunity to experience a number of different trades.
- 4Trades (Dunedin) Bill Cubitt (Manager)
 4Trades was established to provide debt-free training and employment for young people. Acting as the employer, the scheme takes on the contractual responsibilities and hosts the apprentice from six months to a full term. This scheme has worked particularly well and can mean apprentices complete their time with several employers.
- o **Pathways** (Rotorua) Annie Ross
 Pathways Rotorua has a strong focus on breaking down the barriers to youth employment in the labour market. Fundamental to their approach is building strong networks amongst 4 key industries: Tourism, Agriculture, Retail and Engineering whilst engaging the schools and wider community. In July 2004, an modern apprenticeship scheme will be launched with 14 Maori cadets in conjunction with local iwi.


